




- Some members of our group would like more information about how the answering service operates, the schedule, etc


Bulletin Questions

Please check the two sections of the bulletin that are most valuable to you/your group. 58 responses






- My group gives our bulletin reader leeway to read what they want from the bulletin. so my answers above reflect what I think are prompts important to the meeting attendees. Currently, the bulletin layout causes our reader, and caused our previous reader, difficulty. Both these readers, for whatever reason, don't/didn't realize the opening summary gets repeated in the detailed bulletin sections and so they read repetitive information. (Yes, I should guide them about this. I'll do so or my middle name isn't "Procrastination.") On a personal note, when I read the bulletin for myself, I read the entire bulletin. It is all important. A bulletin redesign, as I've included in several answers, would help. Also, the web-access bulletin pages function strangely to me. When using the drop down menu "this week's" and "last week's" open a bulletin but have no links/menus for the full site. That seems strange to me. What about opening a site page (e.g., the events pages) that displays the bulletin but is also a full site page--banner/header, dropdown menus and all? And that page could include a "download version"/PDF options. Also, the Archives page is pure '80s/'90s web design. At least when I open the archives, it's an "Index of/bulletins" and a run of PDFs. Let's modernize that display so the bulletins appear as web pages with a download option, and again keep all web architecture (header, menus) available on the page.




- Pricing out a lot of people. Or the price is fine but our event is in the same timeframe of other events so choices get made.

Does your group support a current institution commitment outside of the Intergroup? 58 responses




How can Intergroup do more to encourage participation in institution commitments?


Intergroup Office Questions

How often have you or your group visited the Intergroup Office in the last 12 months? 58 responses




If you or your group visited the Intergroup Office in the last 12 months, what was the purpose?




Have you always reached someone when calling the office?



What times would it be convenient for you to go to the Intergroup Office to be open? (Pick 2 options)






